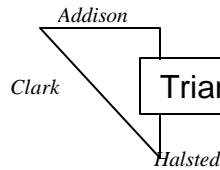

Triangle Neighbors and NeighborSpace are proud to announce we closed on the first lot at 815 W Roscoe Street in what will eventually become a community park. We now start Phase II to acquire the second, adjacent lot at 817 West Roscoe Street.

There is a lot more work to do and this Sunday you can help by visiting our "Lemonade Stand" at the site of the Park during the LVCC Garden Walk (12N–5PM). It's a great way to learn more about our efforts and meet your neighbors. We'll have a "tip" jar to collect your tax-deductible donations. The **LAKE VIEW CITIZENS' COUNCIL (LVCC)** is a non-profit civic organization serving the **Lakeview** community on the north side of Chicago, Illinois. Its boundaries (roughly Lake Michigan on the east, the north branch of the Chicago River on the west, Diversey Parkway on the south, going south on Lakewood Avenue until it meets the Chicago River, and Irving Park Road on the north) are approximately those of the original township of Lake View founded in the early 1800's and annexed by the City of Chicago in 1903.

We have been working for you in Lake View since 1952. We are a grassroots membership organization made up of people like you and your neighbors. LVCC was established to provide citizens in Lake View with the opportunity to work together for the common good of the Lake View community.
