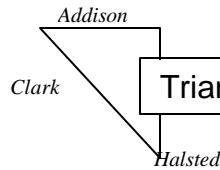

Smoking Ban Ordinance: Be Heard

The City of Chicago recently introduced the Clean Indoor Air ordinance to ban smoking in enclosed public places, including restaurants and bars. If passed, Chicago would join cities like Los Angeles, New York and San Francisco in banning smoking.

The two sides - those that point out the health risk of second hand smoke to employees and non-smokers and those that are concerned with the loss of business and personal choice, have

gathered their forces to lobby their way before a Counsel vote this winter.

LVCC wants to give residents and local businesses an opportunity to be heard before taking a position. On the LVCC website, you can vote your thoughts on the smoking ban by completing the quick survey. LVCC will also sponsor a community forum on the topic later in the month.

Local Update: Speed humps coming soon.

Roscoe Street Re-surfacing

The 800-900 Blocks of West Roscoe Street will remain "unpaved" a little longer than anticipated in our efforts to make sure it satisfies residents' needs. Triangle Neighbors has been working very closely with the 44th Ward Alderman's Office and CDOT to address concerns.

First on the flooding side, Water Management Personnel continue to examine the sewers at 830 West. Possible options include adding an additional sewer and/or building up the curbs.

With respect to the speed humps, these will be installed approximately 60 days after the street has been resurfaced. We welcome your input as to the location of the two speed humps. Right now the plan is have one speed hump immediately west of the alley and a second one half way down the block. The humps will be made from recycled tires to reduce noise levels.

Please take special note of any "no parking" signs that are posted. Resurfacing itself will take 10-12 business days.
