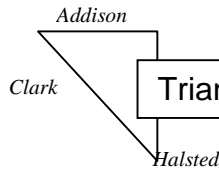

Take me out to the newly renovated Wrigley Field for the Chicago Cubs' Opening Weekend Games, April 7 - 9th, against St. Louis. You'll note this year all Friday afternoon games will be at 1:20PM. The Cubs eliminated the 2:20PM starts in response to neighbors who stressed these games make it hard to find parking for residents when coming home from work.

To improve Opening Day flow of traffic, there will be no parking on Clark Street (Cornelia to Addison) from 7AM to 9PM. Signs will be posted on the meters but please be aware in advance.

Space Park: Golf Outing & Park Clean-up

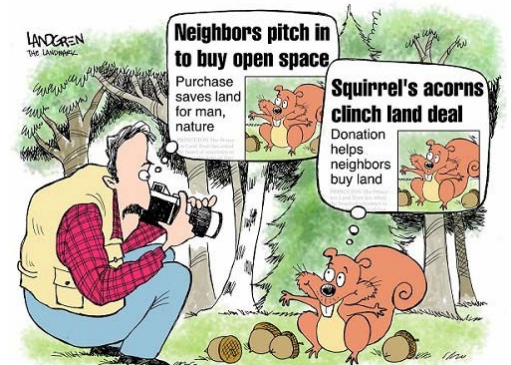
On the heels of the successful Charity Bachelor Auction, we are planning our next fundraising event - An Urban Eden Golf Tournament.
