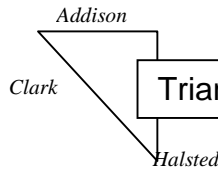

Bachelor Auction Raises \$10,000

Our Charity Bachelor Auction (for him or for her) raised about \$10,000 towards our efforts to build a community park at 815-817 W Roscoe St. Nineteen bachelors between the ages of 21-50 volunteered to be "on the block" during a fun evening at John Barleycorn's at 3524 N Clark St.

Dozens of local restaurants provided "dinner for two" packages. Several other organizations, like Dance for Life and Improvdate, provided 2 tickets to their event to sweeten the pot. Special thanks goes to our event main sponsors: Boystown Chicago, John Barleycorn, and Rewards Network.

Two different bachelors received bids of over \$1000 each; several received bids of over \$500. Tom Coffey, from the Haymarket Group, was quoted after their successful bid on both 44th Ward Alderman Tom Tunney and their own Ryan Van Meter, as "a little exuberant" in bidding.

Triangle Neighbors is already gearing up for our next fundraiser, a Golf Outing, this Spring 2006.

Primary Elections: March 21st

Your voting experience is going to be different this Spring. Due to new legislation passed in Springfield, this is the first year that Cook County will allow early voting and grace period voting. There will also be new optical scanners and touch screen voting, replacing the old punch card system.

Early voting allows residents to cast their vote before Election Day. In contrast to in-person absentee voting, an early voter does not need to give any reason or justification for voting early. Early voting will take place Feb 27 to March 16th at 69 W Washington Street.

New legislation also established "Grace Period" voting registration to allow you to register an extra two weeks after the normal close of voter registration. You must register at the Board of Registration.

Chicagoans will have their choice of two new ballot systems. Voters can utilize either an easy-to-use, name on the ballot optical-scan system or a state-of-the art electronic touch screen. Although any voter may use the touch screen, most voters are expected to use the optical-scan system (fill in the oval next to the candidates name).

Changes on Clark Street: Coming Soon

Could another hotel be in the plans for our neighborhood? Ideas are brought up all the time for Clark Street and the area across Wrigley Field. If you want to get involved in planning the future of our neighborhood, come to our next TN meeting to learn about the 44th Ward CDDC. We'll be electing two representatives at our June TN meeting.

The Chicago Department of Transportation has plans to install a bike lane on Clark Street from Diversey to Addison. A bike lane is a 5-foot space on the road dedicated to bicyclists. No travel or parking lanes will be removed and no significant impacts to traffic are expected.

Last year, the 44th Ward implemented parking restrictions on Clark Street from Cornelia to Addison two hours before and one hour after Chicago Cubs night and weekend home games.
